1. Background (Planning)

In the era of increasingly globalization, the role of universities as centers for developing quality human resources is increasingly important. The Faculty of Economics and Business (FEB) Warmadewa University continues to encourage its faculty members and students to have global insight, intercultural communication skills, and a deep understanding of the international economy. One effort to support this goal is to involve students in international activities that can provide direct experience and insight into various global perspectives.

The Youth Future Exchange Program is an annual activity held to provide a forum for students from various countries to exchange knowledge, experiences, and innovative thoughts on current global issues. In 2024, this activity was held at Cagayan State University, Philippines, on August 14-18, 2024. This program involves participants from various educational and cultural backgrounds, which aims to broaden their horizons in facing challenges and opportunities in the future.

Based on the FEB Dean's Assignment Letter Number 001/2024, FEB assigned one faculty member and one student, namely Dr. I Made Suniastha Amerta and I Made Toni Hendrawan, to attend the Youth Future Exchange Program as Faculty of Economics and Business Warmadewa University representatives. This assignment aims to provide them with global insights that can be applied in their studies and activities within the FEB environment, as well as to strengthen FEB's international network with universities in other countries. The presence of Dr. I Made Suniastha Amerta and I Made Toni Hendrawan is expected to open up opportunities for further collaboration between the Faculty of Economics and Business Warmadewa University with Cagayan State University and other participating universities.

The program offers students an opportunity to study abroad, experience different cultures, and enhance their academic and personal growth. The program partners with universities worldwide to facilitate a diverse and immersive learning experience. By participating in this activity, it is expected that both students can develop cross-cultural communication skills,

understand international economic and business trends, and contribute to the development of the Faculty of Economics and Business globally.

A. Program Objectives

The program aims to achieve the following objectives.

1. To provide students with international exposure and cross-cultural understanding.
2. To enhance students' academic experience by offering courses not available at their home university.
3. To develop global competencies such as adaptability, problem-solving, and intercultural communication.
4. To build long-lasting friendships and professional networks across the world

B. Details of Participants

The participants from Faculty of Economics and Business, Warmadewa University are consisted of:

1. 1 (one) Faculty member.
2. 1 (one) students.

II. Implementation

The Youth Future Exchange Program 2024 activity was held at Cagayan State University, Philippines, on August 13rd – 18th 2024 (6 days 5 nights). The following are some goals of the program.

- 1) To provide students with first-hand experience of diverse cultures, customs, and societal norms, fostering a global mindset and encouraging respect for cultural differences.

- 2) To offer students the opportunity to take specialized courses abroad, gaining access to new perspectives and methodologies, and broadening their academic expertise.
- 3) To equip students with critical skills such as adaptability, problem-solving, teamwork, and cross-cultural communication, making them more competitive in the global job market.
- 4) To help students grow personally by stepping out of their comfort zones, building self- confidence, and learning to adapt to new environments, challenges, and ways of thinking.
- 5) To establish and maintain strong partnerships between universities, enabling long-term academic collaborations, research opportunities, and student mobility.

The Youth Future Exchange Program 2024 activity has also some external goals as follows.

1. To strengthen academic relationships and partnerships between participating universities across different countries, fostering future collaborations in research, faculty exchanges, and educational projects.
2. To support the sharing of best practices in teaching and learning, encouraging innovation in curriculum design, pedagogy, and academic resources on an international scale
3. To improve the global standing of partner universities by showcasing their commitment to internationalization, cross-border student mobility, and educational excellence.
4. To contribute to local and global economies by supporting student mobility, encouraging tourism, and increasing the demand for housing, services, and educational resources in host countries.

III. Result and Evaluation

All the activities of the Youth Future Exchange Program have been completed successfully. Some expected result that considered to be achieved as follows.

1. Participants will return with enhanced knowledge in their fields of study, having gained new insights from courses, instructors, and academic environments abroad, and successfully transferring academic credits.
2. Students will form lasting relationships with peers, faculty, and professionals from around the world, building an international network that can support their academic and career pursuits.
3. Students will develop greater self-confidence, resilience, and independence after navigating challenges in a foreign country, managing their academic and personal lives abroad.

IV. Control

The control elements in the Youth Future Exchange Program activities at Cagayan State University, Philippines, on August 13-18, 2024, aim to ensure that the implementation of the program runs according to the plans, standards, and objectives that have been set. The following are the control aspects applied in this activity.

1. Monitoring Participant Attendance and Participation.
2. Control is carried out by recording attendance and monitoring the active participation of each participant during the activity sessions. The presence of Made and Toni, as well as all participants from other universities, is controlled to ensure full involvement in seminar sessions, group discussions, and workshops. This attendance is an indicator of the level of involvement and commitment of participants in the program.
3. Assessment of Program Achievements

4. Control is also carried out by assessing the achievement of each stage of the program, such as the success of the cultural exchange session, global issue discussions, and collaborative projects. The organizing committee and faculty representatives from each university review the progress of the activities and whether all program targets have been achieved. This control ensures that the main objectives of the program, namely the exchange of knowledge and global understanding, are achieved properly.
5. Quality Control of Materials and Implementation of Activities
6. Every material presented in seminar and workshop sessions is checked and monitored for quality to ensure relevance and suitability to the main theme of the activity. This control includes verification of materials from speakers and facilitators to ensure that the content presented meets academic standards and is relevant to the needs of participants.
7. Evaluation of Participant and Speaker Feedback
8. Final control is carried out through evaluations from participants and speakers who provide input on the implementation of the activity. This evaluation involves questionnaires and open discussion sessions to identify the strengths and weaknesses of the program implementation. The results of this feedback are collected and analyzed to improve similar activities in the future.
9. Recording and Documentation of Activities
10. All activities in this program are documented as a form of control, which includes recording discussion results, achievement reports, photo and video documentation, and reports on the implementation of the activity as a whole. This documentation is not only as an activity report but also to see whether all activities are running according to plan and providing the expected impact.

With a strong element of control, the Youth Future Exchange Program activities at Cagayan State University are expected to be implemented well according to plan and have a positive impact on all participants and institutions involved.

The Student Exchange Program offers students a unique opportunity to gain global experience, enhance their academic knowledge, and develop essential skills for the future. By fostering cultural exchange and international collaboration, the program prepares students to thrive in a diverse, interconnected world while promoting mutual understanding and global citizenship.

V. Improvement

The improvement elements in the Youth Future Exchange Program held at Cagayan State University, Philippines, on August 13-18, 2024, aim to improve and develop the quality of activities to be more effective and beneficial in the future. Evaluation of previous programs and input from participants and the committee are the main foundations in this improvement effort. The following are the improvement steps implemented:

1. Improvement and Refinement of Program Materials

Based on evaluations from participants and direct monitoring, improvements were made by improving and adjusting the materials presented, so that they were more relevant to the theme and needs of participants. Materials that were considered less effective or less in-depth were updated, and new, more up-to-date topics were added, especially those related to global issues and intercultural skills.

2. Improving the Quality of Speakers and Facilitators

One of the improvement efforts was selecting speakers and facilitators who have special expertise according to the program theme, as well as the ability to interact with international participants. The selection process for speakers and facilitators was improved to ensure that they could provide relevant and interesting materials and were able to build interactive and beneficial discussions for participants.

3. Development of Interactive Learning Methods

To increase participant participation and involvement, interactive learning methods such as workshops, role-plays, and intercultural simulations were increased. These improvements aim to enrich the learning experience with hands-on activities, so that participants can develop cross-cultural communication and collaboration skills in a fun and effective atmosphere.

4. Improvement of Facilities and Accommodation

Based on input from participants and evaluation of the implementation, improvements were also made to facilities that support activities, such as providing a more comfortable space, adequate presentation tools, and a stable internet connection. In addition, participant accommodation and transportation were improved to increase their comfort during the activities.

5. Creation of a More Comprehensive Evaluation Platform

To obtain more detailed input, a more comprehensive evaluation platform was created, including an online questionnaire and evaluation discussion session. This platform allows participants to provide feedback more easily and quickly, and covers specific aspects related to comfort, understanding of the material, and overall satisfaction with the program.

6. Development of Wider International Cooperation

The program was improved by expanding the network of cooperation with more universities and organizations in other countries. This is done to increase the diversity of perspectives in activities, as well as enrich collaboration between students from various cultural backgrounds, which in turn will further strengthen the university's internationalization mission.

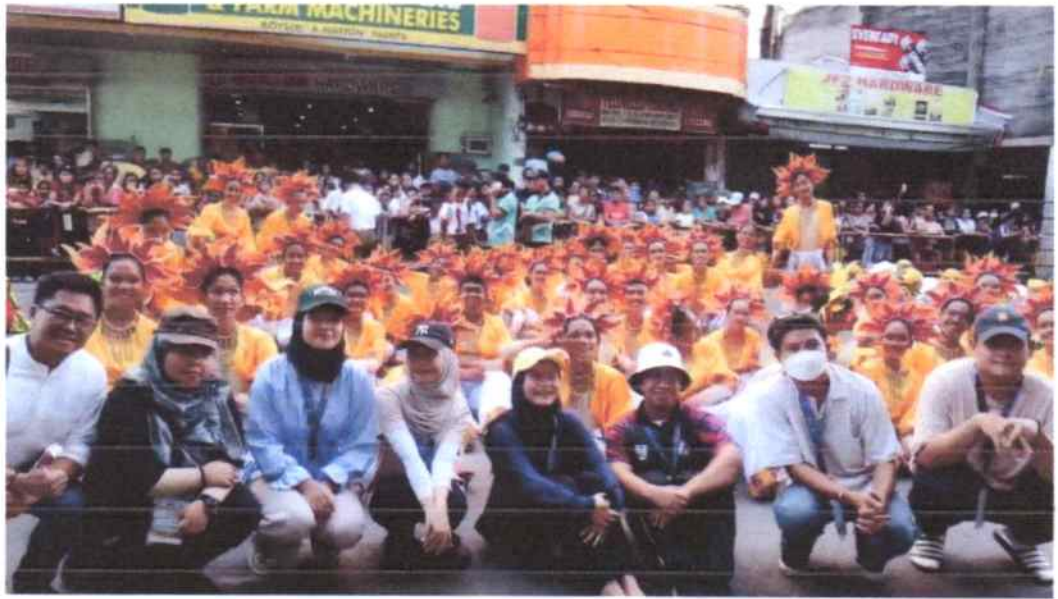
